#### Learning Goals: Educational definition of learning goals and their importance

"The co-construction of 'Individual Student Learning Goals' serve a variety of functions that are essential in the teaching process: goals regulate action and they explain the nature of the link between the past and the future. Goals have a self-energizing effect if they are appropriately challenging for our students, as they can motivate students to exert effort in line with the difficulty or demands of the goal. 'Feedback' and 'Conferencing' allows for realistic goals to be set and for monitoring of those goals so that adjustments in effort, direction and even strategy can be made as needed."

Students across the school have recently reviewed, refined or created new learning goals for this upcoming term. We aim to construct 2-3 specific learning goals (based on the developmental stage of learning for your child) in the area of Mathematics, Literacy and/or Social-Emotional. Your child and their teacher will be sharing these learning goals with you over the coming days/week.

#### Nature Play Upgrade:

Some fine detail but important detail is being finalised between the Education Department and Port Adelaide Enfield Council. This pertains to licensing and access agreements which require sign off at a Crown Solicitor and Ministerial level. The school has been ready and prepared for months and are looking forward to moving this project forward. We are raring to go!! Stay tuned as its not far off now!!

#### \$25000 Federal Grant:

Recently, we were successful in securing a \$25000 grant from the Federal Government under the National School Upgrade Program. This funding was targeted for the Life Science Centre with minor upgrade work, repair and replacement of identified items. Shannon, Michael and Sonya are very excited and look forward to putting their plans into place. This now means, we can redirect school funding to upgrade the Broad Street toilets as planned.

Purple Magpie is a calm, nurturing and supportive learning environment where all students are valued. At the start of the day, students are invited to sign in and complete a morning activity, before entering the class.

Our morning Care Circle is a daily routine that supports students' sense of belonging. As a group, we read an Acknowledgement Of Country, we greet each other and discuss the school values. This is also a chance for students to share how they are feeling and any exciting news in their lives.

#### "I feel happy in our learning space" – Isabelle



# News from The Nest Numeracy in the Nest

Developing a strong sense of number is an important concept that develops from a very young age. Number sense is the ability to understand numbers and the relationships between numbers. For our Nest children this includes:

- Number identification recognising and naming numbers
- 'One to one correspondence' understanding that when counting each number relates to one specific thing being counted
- Knowing that numbers always come in a set order
- Developing an awareness of number patterns.
- Comparing quantities

This term the children have been practicing writing numerals, counting object, matching numerals to quantities, ordering numerals, counting and ordering quantities.


