NAIDOC stands for National Aboriginal and Islander Day Observance Committee. The theme for NAIDOC 2023 is 'For our Elders'.

National NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia in the first week of July each year (Sunday to Sunday), to celebrate and recognise the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC Week is an opportunity for all Australians to learn about First Nations cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures on earth.

On Wednesday 28th we welcomed Trent Hill from Indigenous Culture for Kids, Trent is an Indigenous storyteller, educator and guide who has worked at Adelaide Botanic Garden for more than 10 years. Trent spent the day at Alberton running cultural artefact and story telling workshops, supported by The Aboriginal Education Team.

Trent worked in Coral, Purple, Green, Teal and Orange classes sharing his knowledge around important traditional artefacts used in Aboriginal culture. Trent shared the importance of The Dreaming, looking after our land, family and connection to country. Students had the opportunity to ask Trent questions and share stories with him about Aboriginal culture. Trent highlighted the importance of cultural protocols and played different animal noises on the Yidaki (Didgeridoo).

Trent will be returning to Alberton Primary School to continue culture workshops in Blue, Coral, Yellow and Ochre later this year. If you are visiting the Botanic Gardens in Adelaide keep an eye out for and say hello to Trent! We can't wait to continue learning from Trent, we really valued his knowledge and listening to his stories and discussing the importance of passing knowledge and stories from generation to generation.
