Purple and Indigo Magpie are inclusive and supportive learning communities. We have co-constructed class expectations that help us learn in a respectful and productive manner.

Every morning our classes begin with a Care Circle; a calm and predictable routine that supports students' sense of belonging. Our Care Circle involves greeting every student, reading an Acknowledgment of Country, running through our daily schedule and completing the roll. We finish with a positive primer to get students smiling and ready for learning.

Students have established positive relationships with their peers through collaborating for paired reading, playing maths games, working together in table groups and completing their class jobs.





In Purple Magpie, we have a class pet called Rex. Each week a different student takes Rex home for the weekend and records his adventures in his journal. Students love to share about Rex's experiences. This is a great way for students to connect with their peers, show curiosity through asking questions and develop confidence in their spoken communication.

Each Friday we warmly welcome many current and new families to the Nest to join our playgroup which runs from 8:45am – 10:45am.


