SHINING A IGHT ON MATHS

Sky Magpie

Mathematics is so ingrained in our daily lives that we often don't even notice that we're using it. From simple tasks such as measuring ingredients, to more complex decisions involving finances and problem-solving. The embedded nature of maths in our everyday lives highlights it's importance, and the need for proficient mathematical skills.

Throughout this year at Alberton, we have continued to 'shine a light' on Mathematics, and how we teach it. We have partnered up with North Haven Primary School and have had several joint training days focussing on maths, and how we can improve our teaching of maths. This has resulted in the development of a 'Maths Instructional Model' (a structural model for our maths lessons here at Alberton).





Using cards to play 'salute' is a fun, engaging way to consolidate number fact knowledge.

The teaching of maths often lends itself to being taught through hands-on interactive games to practice, promote and reinforce mathematical concepts being taught. In Sky Magpie we play games such as table bingo and salute and race to 100 to practice times tables and number facts. Our weekly homework sheet nearly always has a maths game that can be played by families to promote a positive leaning disposition towards Maths.

NEWS FROM THE NEST




This year our Nest Team have been working alongside Occupational Therapists to further enhance our strategies and knowledge in supporting children to develop emotional literacies and regulation strategies. Educators have been redesigning learning spaces, helping children to learn about how to identify changes in their emotions or readiness to learn and what strategies they can use to regulate themselves, and expanding the flexible seating and group times strategies to be inclusive and support our young learners. Helping children to develop the skills and understanding to be successful and independent learners is such an important component of the Nest learning program.
